1 Samuel 1 :17

“Go in peace and may the God of Israel grant you what you have asked of him.”

1 Samuel 2 :2

“There is no one holy like the LORD; there is no one besides you; there is no Rock like our God.

1 Samuel 3 :19

The LORD was with Samuel as he grew up, and he let none of Samuel’s words fall to the ground.

1 Samuel 4 :22

“The Glory has departed from Israel, for the ark of God has been captured.”

1 Samuel 5 :11b

“Send the ark of the god of Israel away; let it go back to its own place, or it^{will} kill us and our people.” For death had filled the city with panic; God’s hand was very heavy on it.

1 Samuel 6 :3

“If you return the ark of the god of Israel, do not send it back to him without a gift; by all means send a guilt offering to him. Then you will be healed, and you will know why his hand has not been lifted from you.”

1 Samuel 7 :3

So Samuel said to all the Israelites, “If you are returning to the LORD with all your hearts, then rid yourselves of the foreign gods and the Ashtoreths and commit yourselves to the LORD and serve him only, and he will deliver you out of the hand of the Philistines.”

1 Samuel 8 :7

And the LORD told him: “Listen to all that the people are saying to you; it is not you they have rejected, but they have rejected me as their king.

1 Samuel 9 :17

When Samuel caught sight of Saul, the LORD said to him, “This is the man I spoke to you about; he will govern my people.”

1 Samuel 10 :1

Then Samuel took a flask of olive oil and poured it on Saul’s head and kissed him, saying, “Has not the LORD anointed you ruler over his inheritance?

1 Samuel 11 :14

Then Samuel said to the people, “Come, let us go to Gilgal and there renew the kingship.”¹⁵ So all the people went to Gilgal and made Saul king in the presence of the LORD. There they sacrificed fellowship offerings before the LORD, and Saul and all the Israelites held a great celebration.

1 Samuel 12 :24

But be sure to fear the LORD and serve him faithfully with all your heart; consider what great things he has done for you.

1 Samuel 13 :13

“You have done a foolish thing,” Samuel said. “You have not kept the command the LORD your God gave you; if you had, he would have established your kingdom over Israel for all time.

1 Samuel 14 :6b

Jonathan said to his young armor-bearer, “Come, let’s go over to the outpost of those uncircumcised men. Perhaps the LORD will act in our behalf. Nothing can hinder the LORD from saving, whether by many or by few.”

1 Samuel 15 :22b

But Samuel replied: “Does the LORD delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices as much as in obeying the LORD? To obey is better than sacrifice, and to heed is better than the fat of rams.

1 Samuel 16 :7b

The LORD does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart.”

1 Samuel 17 :45

David said to the Philistine, “You come against me with sword and spear and javelin, but I come against you in the name of the LORD Almighty, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied.

1 Samuel 18 :12

Saul was afraid of David, because the LORD was with David but had departed from Saul.

1 Samuel 19 :8b

Once more war broke out, and David went out and fought the Philistines. He struck them with such force that they fled before him.

1 Samuel 20 :17

And Jonathan had David reaffirm his oath out of love for him, because he loved him as he loved himself.

1 Samuel 21 :11b

But the servants of Achish said to him, “Isn’t this David, the king of the land? Isn’t he the one they sing about in their dances: “‘Saul has slain his thousands, and David his tens of thousands?’”

1 Samuel 22 :23

Stay with me; don’t be afraid. The man who wants to kill you is trying to kill me too. You will be safe with me.”

1 Samuel 23 :4

Once again David inquired of the LORD, and the LORD answered him, “Go down to Keilah, for I am going to give the Philistines into your hand.”

1 Samuel 24 :13 – 14

As the old saying goes, ‘From evildoers come evil deeds,’ so my hand will not touch you. “Against whom has the king of Israel come out? Who are you pursuing? A dead dog? A flea?”

1 Samuel 25 :32 – 33

David said to Abigail, “Praise be to the LORD, the God of Israel, who has sent you today to meet me. ³³ May you be blessed for your good judgment and for keeping me from bloodshed this day and from avenging myself with my own hands.

1 Samuel 26 :23

The LORD rewards everyone for their righteousness and faithfulness. The LORD delivered you into my hands today, but I would not lay a hand on the LORD’s anointed.

1 Samuel 27

1 Samuel 28 :6

He inquired of the LORD, but the LORD did not answer him by dreams or Urim or prophets.

1 Samuel 29 :6

So Achish called David and said to him, “As surely as the LORD lives, you have been reliable, and I would be pleased to have you serve with me in the army. From the day you came to me until today, I have found no fault in you, but the rulers don’t approve of you.

1 Samuel 30 :6b

But David found strength in the LORD his God.

1 Samuel 31 :6

So, Saul and his three sons and his armor-bearer and all his men died together that same day.
